

HYGIENE

Information and Guidance

We hope and trust that you are well and stay well, for now and the coming days and weeks. We also look forward to worshipping with you, be it in the church or online.

As we gather at the church for worship services, it is essential that we follow the guidance given for everyone's health and safety. Even if you feel well, you can put others at risk. As the second greatest commandment is to "love your neighbour as yourself" (Matthew 22.39), please remember that following this guidance is a matter of caring for our community.

In general, if you feel unwell or if you have symptoms (such as a high temperature or a cough), you should stay at home. When you come to a service, you must wear a mask that covers your mouth and nose. Bring your own mask and hand sanitiser. Handwashing facilities are available in the Church Centre, if needed. More specific guidance is given on the reverse side of this card.

GOOD HYGIENE PRACTICES



CONSULT A PHYSICIAN IMMEDIATELY

If you have any symptoms (e.g., fever, cough, difficulty breathing), contact your physician as soon as possible and follow their advice. If you are in a high-risk category, consult your physician before attending a service.



WEAR A MASK AND AVOID TOUCHING YOUR FACE

Wearing a mask is not mandatory. However, if you feel more secure wearing a mask, please do. Avoid touching your face.



COVER YOUR MOUTH AND NOSE COMPLETELY

Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing with tissues or by coughing into your elbow. Please bring a small container for the immediate disposal of used tissues.



WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY

Thoroughly wash your hands before and after the services. Bring hand sanitiser and use it often.



PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING CONSTANTLY

Refrain from shaking hands or embracing upon entering or exiting and even during the Peace. Sit at least 1m apart in the pews. Places will be marked. Socialising is restricted. The Centre will only be opened for use of the restrooms and handwashing facilities.



TAKE COMMUNION SAFELY

Distribution of the communion will be limited to only the bread. Anglican theology has always taught that taking communion 'in one kind' is full participation. When we are able to return to using the chalice, intinction (dipping the bread) will not be allowed. Studies have shown that infections spread more through intinction than through drinking from a common chalice.



GIVE TO THE CHURCH SECURELY

The giving of an offering remains an important part of worship. You can give to the church by online bank transfer or by dropping your offering in the box on the plate at the back of the church.
